To Offer Unique One-Act Play**

Highland Park, IL, October 2, -- A rare celebration of theater and history promises to delight the audience when Highland Park’s own ARTicuLIT Readers Theatre Group presents “Out of Our Fathers’ House, “ Sunday October 14 at 3 PM at the Community House.

A one-act play based on Eve Merriam’s book, Growing Up Female in America: Ten Lives,” the ARTicuLIT Readers Theatre will recreate the lives of six historical figures. The text of the play is taken entirely from the dairies, journals and letters of six notable women of the time and provides rare insights into their challenging lives. The women in the spotlight will include Elizabeth Stanton, founder of the Suffrage Movement; Maria Mitchell, first acknowledged woman astronomer in the US and labor organizer, “Mother” Mary Jones.

“The ARTicuLIT Readers Theatre breathes life into these powerful historical figures, and we have a great time presenting them afresh to the Community,” noted Jacqui Jarrett, Highland Park resident and founders of the theater group. “The intimate setting of the community House is the perfect venue for our reader’s theatre format.”
